Central Colorado Area Health Education Center (CCAHEC) has been a host organization for the Regional Health Connectors (RHC) Program for Colorado Health Statistic Region (HSR) 17 which covers Park, Clear Creek and Gilpin counties and for HSR 4, covering El Paso and Teller counties.

Funding for the Regional Health Connector program was allocated through June 2019. We have been working hard to secure funding to sustain the program, but have so far been unsuccessful. Unfortunately, this program will come to an end for CCAHEC this summer.
